The Constitution

The Constitution sets out the principles to be followed by the Déline Got'ine Government. (FSGA 3.3.1)

The Constitution must be approved by the members of the Dél_[ne First Nation Band and the Dél_[ne Land Corporation. (FSGA 31.1.1)

The Constitution does not need to be approved by Canada or the GNWT.



The Constitution

The Constitution describes:

- the institutions of Déline Got'ine Government,
- the principles of good government,
- how Déline Government will work,
- who is a Citizen,
- how the Constitution can be amended.







Preamble of Constitution

- we are the Sahtuto'ine, the descendants of Eht'se Aya.
- we honour Great Bear Lake.
- we live in harmony with the lands, waters and animals.
- we respect the wisdom of the Prophet, our ancestors and our elders.
- we respect our traditional knowledge.
- we respect our language.
- we have negotiated to establish a unified government at the community level.



Principles of Government

Déline will be governed:

• as one people under a single institution: the Déline Got'ine Government.

The Government will:

- respect the Sahtu Land Claim Agreement.
- observe openness and transparency.
- respect our traditions and culture.
- collaborate with other Aboriginal people, our neighbours, non-Aboriginal residents and other governments.



Principles of Government

As a government, the DGG must:

- act with respect, fairness and without discrimination,
- consult with all Dél_ine citizens on important decisions,
- encourage free expression and participation of all Déline citizens,
- act to protect lands, waters and resources and all living things.





Déline Got'ine Laws

The FSGA describes the powers and responsibilities of the DGG.

The FSGA will be protected as a treaty.

The DGG may pass laws as set out in the FSGA.

All laws must comply with the Charter (Canadian Charter of Rights and Freedoms) and follow the FSGA.



Déline Got'ine Government Includes

 Dzené (Community Gathering)





?ekw'ahtįdé (Chief)

4 year term.

Chosen by DFN Citizens.

Qualifications:

- A DFN citizen,
- Resident of Déline,
- Minimum age limit.



Délįnę K'aowadó Ka (Council)

8 – 12 members, 4 year term

- ?ekw'ahtįdé,
- Elders representative,
- Members at large.

Runs the Government.

Passes Laws.



Deline ?qhda K'áowə Kə (Elders Council)

All elders.

Gives advice to Council.

Appoints a representative to Council.





Dél₁ne K'a Dats'eredi Kə (Justice Council)

3 – 5 members, 4 year term.

Independent Body

- Dispute resolution,
- Violations of DGG Law,
- Appeals from DGG decisions.



Beneficiaries Board

3 – 5 Members, 4 year term.

Elected by resident and non-resident land claim beneficiaries.

Manages land claim monies and lands.

Gives direction to Council on land claim matters.



Dél_linę Łénats'ehdá Dzené (Community Gathering)

Meets once a year at least.

All DFN Citizens.

All residents of Deline District.

Receives reports from DGG.

Receives reports on Land Claim Matters.





DFN Citizens

- 1. Members of the Déline First Nation Band and
- 2. Members of the Dél_ine Land Corporation will be citizens of Dél_ine First Nation.

Exception

A person who is a citizen of another self-government agreement is not eligible to be a DFN citizen.



Duties of Citizens

Work together, to seek consensus and harmony.

Help each other and respect one another.

Help the community.

Respect our elders, our leaders and support the youth.

Live in harmony and protect the land, the environment, the waters, the animals and plant life.



Official Languages

The official languages of the DGG are North Slavey and English.

All persons may communicate with the DGG in either language.





Accountability

The DGG is accountable to DFN Citizens and to residents of the Dél₁ne District.

The DGG must give annual reports to the Dél_lnę Łénats'ehdᣠDzené (Community Gathering) about its work and the administration of the land claim.



Amendment of Déline Got'ine ?e>adó (Constitution)

- Secret ballot
- 60% majority of those who vote
- At least 25% of DFN citizens have to vote



Amendment of FSGA

- Secret ballot,
- 60% majority of those who vote,
- 25% of DFN citizens have to vote.

Exception

Minor amendments to FSGA can be approved by Deline K'aowədó Kə (Council) provided the amendment has been previously reported to the Déline Łénats'ehdə Dzené (Community Gathering).
