

The Délįnę Got'įnę Government (DGG) will take over all the responsibilities of the Délįnę First Nation, the Délįnę Land Corporation and the Délįnę Charter Community. Some programs, such as education, will be transitioned over a period of years as the DGG develops capacity.

Under the Final Self-Government Agreement (FSGA), the DGG has authority to manage programs and activities and pass laws in the following areas.

### Education and Training (in cooperation with GNWT)

- Daycare Services and Kindergarten (Chapters 6 and 7)
- Primary and High School (Chapter 6)
- Post-Secondary and Adult Education (Chapter 8)

### Health (in cooperation with GNWT and Canada)

- Provision of Traditional Healing Services (Chapter 14)
- Administrative agreements can be negotiated with GNWT and Canada on delivery of health programs in the Déline District (Chapter 14)

# **Adoption**

 A Déline Adoption Law will apply, with the consent of the parents or guardians of the child (Chapter 10)

#### Children At Risk

- A Déline Child and Family Services Agency can be established now in collaboration with GNWT (Chapter 11)
- Déline may take over this service completely after 10 years and pass its own Child Protection Law (Chapter 11)
